On August 16, 2017, the Petitioner National Labor Relations Board filed a motion for divided argument, pursuant to Rules 21 and 28.4 of the Rules of this Court. The motion requested that oral argument be divided between two counsel, one representing the Board and the other representing the remaining private-party Respondents. The Board requested 20 minutes of argument time, with the remaining 10 minutes being allocated to the private-party Respondents Stephen Morris, et al., Jacob Lewis, and Sheila Hobson.¹ The motion stated that Morris, Lewis, and Hobson agreed to this allocation of time. The motion also noted that Counsel for the Board, Lewis and Hobson agreed that Richard Griffin and


¹ Hobson was the charging party before the Board in *Murphy Oil, USA, Inc* and the intervenor in the underlying appeal from the Fifth Circuit, *NLRB v Murphy Oil* (No. 16-307).

Daniel Ortiz would argue for the Board and the private-party Respondents, respectively, and that counsel for Morris consented only to the division of time and to Griffin's participation in the argument on behalf of the Board.

The Board wishes to advise the Court that all counsel for the private-party Respondents now agree that Daniel Ortiz will argue for the private-party Respondents if divided argument is granted.

WHEREFORE, the Board respectfully requests that the Court grant its motion for divided argument, and direct that argument be divided between one attorney for the Board and one attorney for the private-parties, with 20 minutes allocated to the Board and 10 minutes to the private parties.
